LEGAL LIABILITY



Duty of Care:

Tort law – legal obligation to standard of reasonable care when engaging in activity that could potentially harm others (such as driving)



Negligence: Breach of duty of care



Liability falls on the negligent party

COLLECTING EVIDENCE



Call Police



Take pictures or video using the camera on your cellphone

Damage to both vehicles
Position of both vehicles
Weather conditions
Skid marks

Video of witness statements



Have your lawyer subpoena the other driver's cell phone record

COLLECTING DAMAGES



Property Damage:

Repair or replacement of car/personal belongings



Out-of-Pocket:
Car rental cost and products for injuries



Medical Bills:

Any bills incurred from examination or treatment due to accident



Pain and Suffering: Intangible losses from accident
