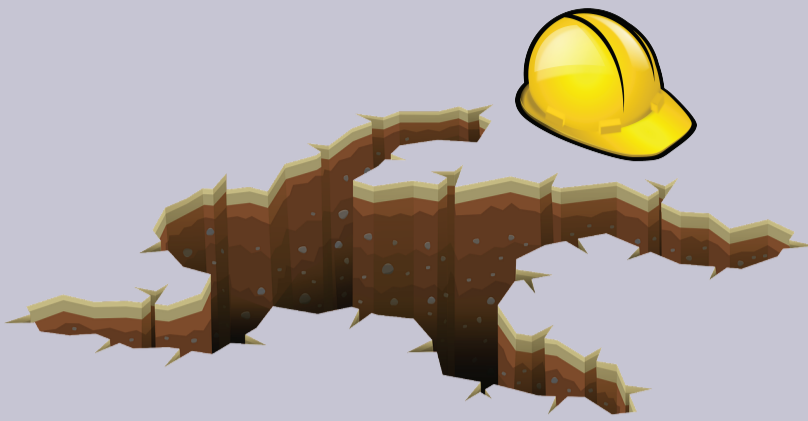

# HURT AT WORK

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If you're hurt on the job, you probably have a lot of questions running through your mind. "Do I need to tell someone about this?" HERE IS A CHECKLIST OF THE BASIC STEPS YOU SHOULD FOLLOW AFTER BEING HURT ON THE JOB.

## 1 Report your Injury.

Report your injury to your supervisor as soon as possible after your accident.



## 2 Get a copy of the report.

Make sure your injury report is filled out, and request a copy for your records.

## 3 Request treatment.

If you need to see a doctor as a result of your work injury, tell your employer.



## 4 Be thorough in describing your injury.

Report all aches and pains, not just the main injury. If it becomes a serious problem later, it'll be hard prove it is related to your work accident.



## 5 Keep all appointments and follow all medical treatment.

Missing appointments with the company doctor or ignoring medical advice can result in your benefits being terminated.



## 6 Make sure you are receiving your benefits.

If the doctor determines that you are unable to work, you should be entitled to temporary total disability benefits.



## 7 Know when to contact an attorney.

If you feel you are being denied any benefits, or are pressured into giving a statement or settling your claim, do not wait to contact a Missouri workers' compensation attorney.
